## **NCYM Spiritual Gifts Assessment**

Spiritual gifts are God-given and because every Christian is to be a minister, God has given at least one spiritual gift to every believer. Spiritual gifts are distributed according to God's plan and purposes and are given for the good of the whole body of Christ. (Scripture References: I Corinthians 12 & Romans 12:4-5)

We have developed a simple assessment to assist us with identifying our spiritual gifts, especially those matching the work of NCYM. The process does not encompass a complete list of spiritual gifts; rather, it gives consideration to the following 17 gifts, categorically:

- Desire to minister to unreached people in other communities or countries
- Have responsibilities to oversee ministries or groups of churches
- Demonstrate authority and vsion for the mission of the church

## Cautions for People with this gift:

- Should be aware that misusing their authority can quench the Spirit in others

- Should avoid becoming critical of others that do not share their same
- Need to be able to listen carefully, as the same evangelical method will not be appropriate for everyone.

- Should discern from God when to give
- Don't brag about gifts that were given

#### Cautions for people with this gift:

- Need to remember that God sometimes works through our pain.
- Should guard against becoming defensive or angry about the sources of other people's pain.
- Need to realize their value, even if it isn't always voiced.

**Explanation**: To nurture and guide

**Description:** The gift of shepherding is the God-given ability to nurture, care for and guide people into a relationship with Christ.

- Establish trust and confidence in relationships

- Prepare for speaking through times of study and reflection.
- Give attention to detail and accuracy

## People with this gift are:

- Disciplined
- Teachable
- Practical
- Well-Spoken
- Authoritative

## Cautions for people with this gift:

- Should avoid being prideful about their extensive biblical knowledge
- May become too focused on details rather than life applications
- Should remember that spirituality is not measured by how much they know.
- Remember greatest influence comes through relationships

- Receive an understanding of what is necessary to meet the needs of the body
- Provide divinely given solutions in the midst of conflict and confusion
- Hear the Spirit provide direction for God's best in a given situation
- Apply spiritual truth in specific and practical ways

## People with this gift are:

- Sensible
- Insightful
- Practical
- Wise
- Fair
- Experienced
- Common Sense

#### Cautions for people with this gift:

- Could fail to share the wisdom that God has given them
- Need to avoid having others develop a dependence upon them, which may weaken their faith in God
- Need to be patient with others who do not have this gift

- € **Learning**: the ability to study, gather, understand, improve, expand self.
- € Managing; the ability to run, handle, oversee.
- € **Mechanical**: the ability to operate, service, and repair equipment and machinery.
- € **Mentoring**: the ability to advise, guide, teach.
- € **Motivating**: the ability to provoke, induce, prompt.
- € **Negotiating**; the ability to discuss, consult, settle.
- € Organizing: the ability to simplify, arrange, fix, classify, coordinate.
- € **Performing**: the ability to sing, speak, dance, play an instrument, act out.
- € **Pioneering**: the ability to bring about something new, groundbreaking, original.
- € **Planning**: the ability to arrange, map out, prepare.

- € **Promoting**: the ability to sell, sponsor, endorse, showcase.
- € **Recruiting**: the ability to draft, enlist, hire, engage.
- € **Repairing**: the ability to fix, mend, restore, heal.
- € **Researching**: the ability to seek, gather, examine, study.
- € **Resourcing:** the ability to furnish, provide, deliver.
- € **Serving:** the ability to help, assist, fulfill.
- € **Strategizing:** the ability to think ahead, calculate, scheme.
- € **Teaching:** the ability to explain, demonstrate, tutor.
- € **Technology:** operate, service and repair computers and electronics.
- € Translating: the ability to interpret, decode, explain, speak.
- € Visualizing: the ability to picture, imagine, invision, dream, conceptualize.
- € **Welcoming:** the ability to entertain, greet, embrace, make comfortable.
