Why is the Quaker peace testimony important today?

Rules: Essays need to be typed, 12 pt. font, double spaced. Grammar, punctuation, and spelling will be considered. Please submit two copies of your essay. On one copy staple the entry form to the essay. On the second copy type the title only- no personal information. Members of the North Carolina Yearly Meeting’s Peace and Social Issues Committee will judge the entries. This will be a “blind judging.” Entries must be postmarked by April 30, 2010.

Age Categories:

Youth I: grades 1-5 (minimum 150 words)
Youth II: grades 6-12 (maximum 1500 words)
Adult: ages 18 and up (maximum 1500 words)

Prizes for each category:

First: \$100 Second: \$50 Third: \$25

Winners will be invited to read their essay at the 2010 North Carolina Yearly Meeting in Black Mountain, N.C. September 3-6, 2010.
