Bill J. Leonard, Wake Forest Divinity School; Professor of Church History, and of Religion B.A., Texas Wesleyan College; M.Div., Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary; Ph.D., Boston University; D.D., Franklin College

Bill J. Leonard is Professor of Church History at the Wake Forest University School of Divinity, Winston-Salem, North Carolina. In 1996 he joined the faculty of Wake Forest University with joint appointments in the School of Divinity and the Department of Religion. He retired from that role in the spring of 2010. Leonard also served as visiting lecturer at Yale Divinity School (1981) and at the Seinan Gakuin University in Fukuoka, Japan (1988-89). He was a member of the summer faculty of the Appalachian Ministries Educational Resource Center.

Leonard is the author or editor of some 15 books including The Nature of the Church; Word of God Across the Ages: Using Church History in Preaching; Appalachian Christianity: Profiles in Regional Pluralism. He is a frequent lecturer on college and university.
