

WHO can become an intern?

Any graduating high school senior or older who is interested in exploring his or her gifts in ministry. This includes working adults who may be considering a calling to ministry.

WHAT are the responsibilities of an intern?

- 1) Serve the Meeting or other site for a term of at least an 8 weeks, totaling 160 hours*
- 2) Keep track of hours
- 3) Attend regular scheduled meetings for worship, Bible study, and/or the gatherings of specific groups of his or her work (children, youth, seniors...)
- 4) Provide the Meeting with proper promotional information and a calendar of events in relation to their internship
- 5) Meet regularly with the pastor or mentor of the Meeting or other service site
- 6) Meet regularly with the Intern Coordinator and other interns



- 7) Attend Yearly Meeting sessions and encourage participation from the site served

WHAT internship opportunities are available?

There are a wide variety of internship opportunities available. Many interns work with youth or children at local meetings here in North Carolina Yearly Meeting, but there are also opportunities to gain experience in pastoral ministry or in ministry to senior adults. Often there are opportunities to gain ministry experience in more than one role. Work with youth or children, in missions, pastoral ministry, or gain experience in various types of ministry to better discern your calling.

2) Fill out an Intern Application. After you have sent in your application, you will be contacted.

Planning will begin with the details of the service site and your internship.

3) Complete the preparatory workbook and attend the training retreat.

Upon confirmation of your internship, you will receive a workbook including information on biblical and Quaker history, spiritual gifts, Yearly Meeting structure and procedure, etc. This should be completed before the training retreat. This retreat will provide a weekend away from normal settings to give concentrated learning and worship preparation time for the ministry.

4) Continue to meet at scheduled times with the Intern Coordinator and other interns as you serve your internship.
